
GUIDELINES FOR REVIEWERS

Length: Book reviews should be kept within a number of 6,000 to 17,000 characters, including spaces (word count in MS-Word).

Book information: At the beginning of the review, detailed information on the book under review should be provided, including author/editor/translator as applicable, book title, title and volume number of series, place of publication, publisher, page numbers (including front matter), relevant bibliographical information such as index and bibliography, the price for a hardbound (HB) or a paperback copy (PB) and the ISBN. See the following example:

BENJAMIN BROSE, *Patrons and Patriarchs: Regional Rulers and Chan Monks during the Five Dynasties and Ten Kingdoms*. Studies in East Asian Buddhism, 25. Honolulu: University of Hawai'i Press, 2015. xiv, 5, 242 pp. Illustrations, Map, Bibliography, Index. US\$ 55.00 (HB). ISBN 978-0-8248-5381-5

Quotes: All quotes from the book under review should be provided with a page citation in parenthesis following the quote.

References: Footnotes should be avoided; instead all references should be incorporated into the text of your review.

Characters: Include Chinese characters only if necessary for understanding.

Author statement: Name and affiliation of the reviewer should be provided at the end of the review.
